



Let Us Write Correctly

In English we use some symbols or marks in writing. These marks help us to write correct English. Some common marks are full stop, question mark and comma etc.

Bobita: This is my school. I love my school. I always go to school. The name of
my school is Assam Jatiya Bidyalay.

In the above sentences we see a full stop (.) at the end of each sentence. The full stop (.) is used to end a sentence.

Now look at the sentences in the boxes below.

In the box 'A' the sentences are incorrect. There is no full stop (.) at the end of each sentence. But in the box 'B' all the sentences are correct. Every sentence in box 'B' has a full stop (.) at the end of the sentence.



Pabitra: What is your name? Where do you study? Who is your class teacher? How do you go to school? In the above sentences we see a question mark (?) at the end of each sentence. We use question mark (?) when we ask something, or when we ask a question.

Now look at the sentences used by Ms. Pallabi Deka in the classroom.

• Ms. Pallabi Deka: Who teaches you English, Bornil? What is your father? When will you complete your homework? Why did you not come to school yesterday?

In the above sentences Ms. Pallabi Deka asks Bornil questions. In all the sentences a question mark (?) is used at the end.

• Bimal: I read in class IV with Pranmoy, Ritul, Biplab and others. Ritul, Ashim and I always play together at school. We read English, Assamese and three other subjects.

In the above sentences we can see a comma (,) in each sentence. A comma (,) indicates a pause between parts of a sentence.

Now look at the following pairs of sentences.

- 1. I love playing football cricket and chess I love playing football, cricket and chess.
- 2. Delhi Mumbai Chennai etc. are some cities of India. Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai etc. are some cities of India.
- 3. Mango Banana and apple are my favourite fruits.

 Mango, Banana and apple are my favourite fruits.

 In each pair above, the second sentence is correct. The second sentence of every pair uses a comma (,) between parts

In English we write certain letters in capital while others in small letters. We use capital letter in many different words.



Look at the following sentences.

- Bishnu Prasad Rabha is called 'Kalaguru'.
- I live in Guwahati. (ii)
- (iii) We have co-curricular classes on Saturday.
- (iv) We celebrate Bohag Bihu in April.
- (v) The Brahmaputra is a big river.
- (vi) We celebrate Durga Puja.
- (vii) My brother and I study in Assam Jatiya Bidyalay.

In each sentence above we see capital letters used with certain words.

In each sentence a capital letter is used to start a sentence.

- More examples: 1. They are students.
 - 2. The girls are dancing.
 - 3. He is our teacher.

In sentences (i), (ii), (iii) and (iv) above we have used capital letters with the names. The first letter of the names of person, place, week-days and months are always written in capital letters.

- More examples: 1. His name is Prachir.
 - 2. We went to Barpeta.
 - 3. I go to the temple on Monday.
 - 4. July is a hot month.

In sentence (v) we have used capital letters with the name of the river. The first letter of the names of oceans, mountains, hills etc. are always written in capital letters.

- More examples: 1. The largest ocean is the Pacific Ocean.
 - 2. The Himalayas are on the north of India.
 - 3. Kamakhya temple is in the Nilachal Hill.



In sentence (vi) we have used capital letter with the names of festivals. The first letters of the names of special days like Children's Day, Teachers Day, Mothers Day etc. are written in capital letters.



- More examples: 1. Diwali is a festival of light.
 - 2. We celebrate Magh Bihu in January.
 - 3. Our school observes Independence Day.

In sentence (vii) we see that we wrote the letter 'I' in capital. We write 'I' always in capital.

- More examples: 1. I am a good student.
 - 2. Biju and I play together.
 - 3. My brother and I go to school.
