



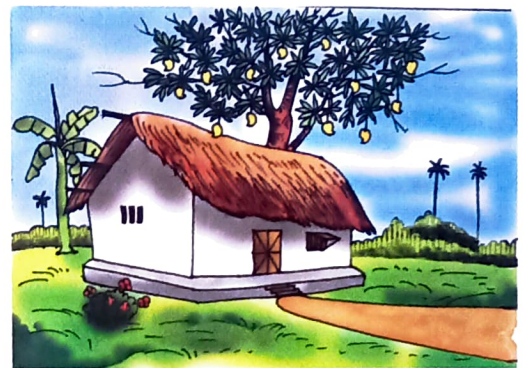
Is Your Name Riya ?

Read and remember

When we ask a question, we use an interrogative sentence. An interrogative sentence always has a question mark (?) at the end. When we negate something, we use a negative sentence. Usually the word “not” is used in a negative sentence.



Now, look at the following table.

Positive	Question	Negative
I am	Am I	I am not
He is	Is he	He is not
She is	Is she	She is not
It is	Is it	It is not
We are	Are we	We are not
You are	Are you	You are not
They are	Are they	They are not
